
KEY EXPERIENCES

ARTIFACTS & OBJECTS

The Academy Museum of Motion Pictures holds one of the world's largest collections of pre-cinematic devices, representing the evolution of moving and projected entertainment as an art and a science.

Highlights include objects spanning centuries and cultures such as:

- Shadow puppets, showcasing the origins of projected entertainment.
- Magic lanterns, which illuminate faraway lands and spook viewers with scenes of ghostly magic.
- Zoetropes and praxinoscopes, which demonstrate the basic concepts that made cinema possible.
- Kinoras and kinetoscopes which lent realism to early moving images with the power of photography.
- Early movie cameras that spread the magic of cinema worldwide.



KEY EXPERIENCES

GRAPHICS & AUDIOVISUAL DISPLAYS

Period advertisements and illustrations from the Margaret Herrick Library's collection add intriguing historical context to the experience. A projected montage of photographic and hand-painted magic lantern slides further entices audiences, while animated demonstrations illustrate the illusions at work in these captivating devices.

HANDS-ON INTERACTIVES

Enchanting hands-on interactives engage guests' creativity and imagination. Visitors spin large-scale zoetropes and praxinoscopes to set playful moving images in motion, while a shadow screen allows guests to recreate classic shadow puppets or dream up their own scenes. Other recreations of pre-cinema devices engage visitors with charming analog illusions.
