This exhibition takes visitors into an underwater environment using cinema scale projections, artefacts and equipment used in Cameron's expeditions. Discover the shipwrecks of *Titanic* and the German battleship *Bismarck*. Contains artefacts from the design and construction of the *DEEPSEA CHALLENGER*. Includes original film props and costumes from *The Abyss* and *Titanic*, including the iconic Heart of the Ocean diamond.
